You Said...We Did...

You asked how Adlington would join in commemorations in this 1918/2018 memorial year.

Adlington Town Council along with Adlington in Bloom purchased and arranged for the erection of two Silent Soldiers in the memorial garden on Railway Road. Adlington Town Council volunteers put up the lamp-post poppies on Railway Road sponsored by Adlington, Anderton and Heath Charnock Councils and John Speers for Royal Dragoon Guards Association.

You raised concerns about disabled access routes around Adlington

We raised a comprehensive summary of issues at the Chorley Council liaison meeting raising:

- The lack of visibility of the pedestrian crossings over the A6 particularly at night when the "beacon" lights are very dim
- The unsuitable nature of these crossings for visually impaired or disabled users as explained in last month's Open Forum, and the need for some alternative audio or physical indication that it is safe to cross
- The need for a consultation to advise on the possibility of creating a "safe route" for pedestrians through the village, linking this to the BBC news item which explained how this had been done in Trafford with the use of white lines on the pavement

You raised concerns around antisocial behaviour in specific areas of Adlington (in which police had been unable to take action)

We raised the issues with Chorley Community Housing to find out more about the incidents and any action which has been or can be taken.

You raised concerns regarding the potential shortfall of primary school places in Adlington & Rivington in the next five years.

Adlington Town Council contacted the LCC Cabinet Member for Education to ask why decisions on this matter are being made by Property Services rather than by the Education Department, and to express concern at the indication that the pressure for school places in Adlington is the result of a shortage of places in Chorley and asked for an explanation of how this will be addressed.

You raised concerns about the potential closure of Chorley Accident & Emergency (A&E) Department.

Adlington Town Council has contacted Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS stating that Chorley has one of the fastest growing populations in the country and it is important that both the Chorley and Preston A&E facilities remain open, pointing out that access from Adlington to Preston is often subject to heavy traffic making it impossible to reach within the "golden hour" required for much emergency care. Closure of the Chorley A&E would also put pressure on emergency facilities outside the county. We copied the letter to local Councillors and the local MP.
