



# The 2020 Citizen Awards and Young Citizen Awards.

### YOU SAID WE DID.....

**You said** ... We are concerned about the 15-year strategic Central Lancashire Development Plan for Chorley, Preston and South Ribble and Options and the possible impact on Adlington services and existing residents.

**ATC** has responded to Central Lancashire Local Plan Issues and Options Consultation following the Ward Dropin meeting on Tuesday 14 January, we have raised concerns about the potential impact on the local infrastructure, rainwater management and other strategic and local aspects.

**You said** ... problems of house owners on a section of Grove Farm Drive, part of the road is wide enough for only one vehicle and there is no turning point at the end of the road. This has led to private driveways being used by vehicles for the purposes of turning and there has been some damage to these as a result.

ATC raised the issue and a sign has been erected.

**You said**...A related matter on Grove Farm Drive was the inadequate capacity of the park and ride facility to serve Adlington Station. As a result, cars are now frequently parked on the public highway to this housing estate. Some of the lights in the car park are out and the vegetation needs cutting back.

**ATC** agreed that the Clerk would contact both Chorley and Lancashire County Councils to support residents and discuss appropriate resolutions and possible signage.

You said...at an open forum, that an area of Jubilee Recreation Ground should be fenced off and be designated for dogs to have some freedom to run within the fenced area. The pros and cons of this proposal were discussed based around: the cost of fencing, signage, the ability to enforce which parts of the Park were used by different sections of the community, and whether dog owners would respect such an area, if designated, by picking up after their own dog and by managing its behaviour when with other dogs within the fenced area. Having a designated dog area is not likely to solve all problems associated with the competing demands from the various users that are placed on public parks. The park is owned by Chorley Council.

**ATC** has written to ask Chorley Council to consider this matter as a Borough-wide issue.
