Weekly Food Parcels for families with children in the South East Chorley area who are struggling to manage household finances and to feed their family

Adlington Town Council is partnering with LW Storehouse, Chorley's Foodbank to provide a weekly food parcel for families with children of school or nursery age who live in the Adlington, Anderton, Heath Charnock, and Rivington areas of South East Chorley. Any family that is struggling due to low or reducing household income, or unemployment, possibly due to Covid-19, is eligible for food assistance valued at £15 per child per week.

LW Storehouse will make up and deliver a weekly food parcel to your home with an in-advance text message alert being issued. **The Community Foundation for Lancashire's Covid 19 Programme** awarded a grant to Adlington Town Council and the Town Council is contributing some money from its own budget to pay for these food parcels to prevent any family from going hungry at this challenging time. The food parcels contain both fresh foods and cupboard staples. Dietary requirements are met where possible.

Every family in receipt of the weekly food parcels will also be given an extra Christmas hamper of seasonal festive foods and sweet treats.

If preferred a family can collect their weekly food parcels from the Living Waters (LW) Connect Café where they will receive a free meal. Lunch and activities will be available for children. Families can access advice and support from other 'Chorley Together' agencies.

The LW Connect Café is opposite the entrance to Asda supermarket on Bolton Road, Chorley.

Individual families and schools can contact LW Storehouse directly to give the name and phone number of families who would benefit from food parcel support.
