The Brothers of Charity who run the Café are supporting the use of Talking Tables which has been set up by Marjorie Haywood to support her Friends for You initiative.

Talking Tables aims to provide a solution to loneliness and isolation. Marjorie believes many people have been shielded and are scared of coming out of their own homes as a result of the Coronavirus Pandemic. She says 'The Talking Tables is a specific table in a café where individuals will be able to go and know that customers are happy to chat to each other. I don't want people to wake up and think, 'oh no, not another day on my own'- I want them to be able to decide to go and find a Talking Table and meet and chat.

The Mayor will be supporting this initiative at the Talking Table in the **Marina Café on most Tuesdays** around **10.30-11:30** am.

YOU SAID WE DID.....

You said ... After the disruption we suffered during the changes to accommodate the electrification of the railway line, why have we got a worse and much reduced service instead of the gold service we were promised.

We have written to the lead on local transport at Lancashire County Council on several occasions copying the rail service providers into our correspondence. We have also written to the Minister for Transport at Whitehall. The response we received did not show any improvement to the service. We have since partnered up with Blackrod Town Council, who are suffering with the same reduced service as us and we will be interrogating the options on offer to promote the best service for Adlington.

You said ...We do not want the mobile mast and associated "street furniture" at the proposed site on Chorley Road.

We have looked at the planning application and we support the Adlington residents' opinions and we also object to the site. Although we are not against the progression of better mobile and internet services, we feel that better options for the site are available such as the ones described by residents who attended the open forum at the beginning of our last council meeting. We have submitted our views to the Chorley Borough Council Planning site supporting your opinions and objecting to that particular site, the application has been withdrawn and we will look out for any further submissions.

You said... Our pavements are cluttered and dirty our residents especially those with wheelchairs, pushchairs, disabilities and with young children cannot proceed safely. We are asking please:

- Park sensibly.
- Cut any overhanging shrubs and greenery.
- Bring your bins in as soon as possible.
- Businesses check that the positions of "A" frames and advertising stands don't impede pedestrians.
- Don't drop litter.
- Clean up after your dogs.

Let's make this village a space we can all enjoy.
