Helen Brown for her dedicated contribution for just over 20 years to Albany Academy where she is currently the Chair of the Board of Trustees.





You said ...we are concerned about the speed of traffic travelling through and around the village.

Adlington Town Council have joined forces with our two local parishes and with the help of Chorley Council we have had a Speed Indicator Device (SpID) installed on Railway Road to record the speed of traffic travelling down the main route between both major roads. The device will be moved between the three council areas on a rota basis. We have also placed a box of FREE stickers for residents to stick on their bins which are large enough to be seen from a vehicle and will remind drivers at least once a week to SLOW DOWN.
